SCULPTURAL ACHIEVEMENTS

The 83rd annual Awards Exhibition of the National Sculpture Society opens at Brookgreen Gardens in South Carolina on August 6. BY JOHN O'HERN

The National Sculpture Society was formed in 1893 to "spread the knowledge of good sculpture." Today it "promotes excellence in sculpture that is inspired by the natural world." Its 83rd annual Awards Exhibition will be held at Brookgreen Gardens, Pawleys Island, South Carolina, August 6 through October 30.

Forty-three works have been chosen from among 980 images submitted by 255 artists. The jurors were Susan Fisher, director of the Renee & Chaim Gross Foundation, and sculptors and society members Michael Bergt and Sherry Sander. The sculptor jurors have been invited to exhibit one work each.

The works of animals and people are sculpted in a wide variety of materials, some not imagined by the founders 123 years ago. In addition to the traditional, bronze, clay, marble, wood and plaster, there are works in steel and others incorporating resins and glass.

Alexander Tylevich is originally from Belarus and has incorporated bronze, glass, wood and magnets in Cubism's Eulogy: Malevich. The figure recalls the painted figures of the Russian abstract theoretician and painter Kazimir Malevich (1878-1935).

Carter R. Jones reaches farther back in history. He says, "To create a living, breathing being, I go as deeply as I can into its magnificent evolutionary design to find out what made it a survivor." His marble Rockcroc resembles a prehistoric head unearthed in a scientific expedition.

Suzanne Storer constructs deep relief figurative wall sculptures in fired ceramic. She writes, "The intent of these calligraphic paintings on three-dimensional surfaces is to depict our contemporary human condition." Her portrait of Alec, My Son is

in the exhibition.
